

Animal Tracking Guide



SQUIRREL Squirrels have a wide and blocky bounding pattern when compared to rabbits. If tracks are clear you may see the long skinny toes. Follow their tracks to a tree!



HOUSE CAT They have 4 toes on their front and hind feet and tend to direct register walk (hind feet landing in the front tracks) when walking in snow.



DOMESTIC DOG Look for 4-toes on each foot, claws that usually (but not always) show, and a triangular shaped heel pad.
